## “Musical Motivators + Materials = Musical Meanings”

Dr. Lorna Zemke, internationally recognized Kodaly music educator, is chair of the Department of Music at Silver Lake College, Manitowoc, WI and Director of the Kodaly programs since the early 1970's. In the mid 1960's, Zemke worked with Katinka Daniel in piloting one of the first Kodaly programs in the U.S. Dr. Zemke was among the first generation of Americans to be trained in the Hungarian system of Music Education; her master's thesis and doctoral dissertation were among the first Kodaly-related studies published in English.

An experienced teacher at all levels, Dr. Zemke has taught graduate & undergraduate courses, presented workshops, clinics, demonstrations and lectures throughout the U.S. and abroad for more than 20 years. She was co-founder of the Midwest Kodaly Music Educators of America (MKMEA), co-chair of the first national Kodaly Conference (OAKE), and later served as president of both organizations. She is a charter member of the International Kodaly Society (IKS) and was among the five Americans invited to Hungary in 1972 to help plan the first International Kodaly Conference. Since then Sr. Lorna has been a U.S. delegate to the International Kodaly Symposia in the U.S., Hungary, Japan, England, Greece and Canada.

In 1984, Sr. Lorna initiated a "Music for Tots" program at Silver Lake College, which has more than 400 children enrolled each semester. In November, 1986, Dr. Zemke developed the program *Lovenotes: Music for the Unborn* working with expectant parents in using music as a bonding language with their unborn babies. In 1989 she published this program in a kit containing a manual plus audio and video cassettes. This publication is currently used throughout the US and many foreign countries. The *LOVENOTES* publication with accompanying CD was translated into Korean by Sangjiwon Co., Inc., Seoul, Korea in 2002. Sr. Zemke is Vice-President and Charter member of the International Music Society for Prenatal Development and former editor of their quarterly newsletter.

Dr. Lorna Zemke has received many honors and awards for her professional service, leadership and performance in the field of music education. She has published many articles and books on a variety of aspects and levels of music education.
